

# 2009 SECURITY SEMINAR AND SHOOTER/HOSTAGE EXERCISE NOVEMBER 4 SACRAMENTO

Given today's ever-changing threat environment, Chemical Sector owners and operators should consider having an incident management plan for an active shooter event or hostage taking at their facility. Successful plant plans will address: communication with employees; employee accountability; coordination with first responders; and communications with the media and public. In the event of such an incident, emergency responders also need to be familiar with the chemical facilities in their local jurisdictions.

## Directions to Sacramento Regional Terrorism Threat Assessment Center (RTTAC):

From Sacramento International Airport, proceed south on I-5 toward downtown Sacramento to the junction with I-80 east toward Reno.

Follow I-80 east approximately 5 miles to Winters St.

Exit I-80 onto Winters St and proceed north to Dudley Blvd.

Turn right onto Dudley Blvd. and proceed a short distance to Forcum Ave (The RTTAC is a secure area on the southwest corner of Dudley Blvd and Forcum Ave.).

Turn right onto Forcum Ave. and park in the lot outside the fence.

Proceed to the visitors' entrance near the flagpole at the south side of the perimeter fence.
